A Brief History of SMCC

Southern Maine Community College (SMCC) has grown and evolved over the years. Our mission today is to transform lives and communities through education and training, and welcome, prepare and inspire all to learn, succeed and lead.

Our role is as vital today as it was in 1946, when the College first opened under the name Maine Vocational Technical Institute (MVTI), a day school in Augusta created to serve returning World War II veterans who needed to learn new skills in a post-war economy. By 1952 MVTI and its 156 students had outgrown their space in Augusta and moved to the site of decommissioned Fort Preble, overlooking beautiful Casco Bay in South Portland. During the 1960s the name was changed to Southern Maine Vocational Technical Institute (SMVTI) and authorization was received to award Associate in Applied Science degrees.

In the late 1980s, the Maine Legislature changed the name of the state's Vocational Technical Institute System to the Maine Technical College System, and SMVTI became Southern Maine Technical College (SMTC). Almost a decade later, in 1998, the College added an Associate in Arts degree in liberal studies to its offerings, a significant step in its evolution to a comprehensive community college.

In 2003 that transformation was complete. Gov. John Baldacci introduced legislation establishing the Maine Community College System – a move that enjoyed strong bipartisan support in the 121st Maine Legislature. The College name was changed once more, this time to Southern Maine Community College.

In 2011, SMCC expanded its effort to provide access to high quality, affordable education by opening a second campus at Brunswick Landing, home of the former Brunswick Naval Air Station. SMCC's Midcoast Campus in Brunswick offers students access to state-of-the-art classrooms and laboratories that support studies in nursing, business, arts and sciences and more.

Today, SMCC students come from across the state and around the globe. Whether they are seeking a degree in the trades and technologies that keep our economy humming, or the arts and sciences that offer a strong and broad educational foundation, SMCC graduates are successful employees, employers and entrepreneurs. Through more than 60 transfer agreements with colleges and universities in Maine and around the country, our students are able to continue their studies in four-year degree programs.

SMCC has come a long way from a small school in Augusta to Maine's largest community college. In the fall of 2020, we served nearly 5,800 students and offered more than 40 degree programs at our campuses in South Portland and Brunswick, satellite community centers, and online. At every step in SMCC's transformation, our College has responded to the changing world and enhanced economic and cultural development for our students and our state.



ACADEMICS

SMCC has more than 40 academic degree and certificate programs in trade and technical fields, as well as in the arts and sciences, that prepare students for careers or for transfer to colleges and universities to continue their education. We offer students hands-on learning led by faculty who work in their fields and have established partnerships with businesses and community leaders.

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Moise Mulamba Kalonji, Electrical Engineering Technologies

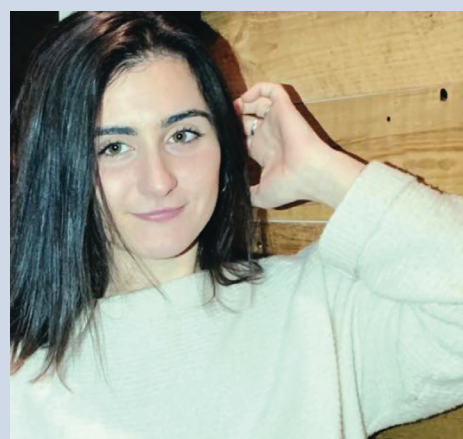

"I'm learning more than just hospitality skills at SMCC. I'm also making connections in the industry, getting up-close looks at businesses in the field, and honing my leadership abilities."

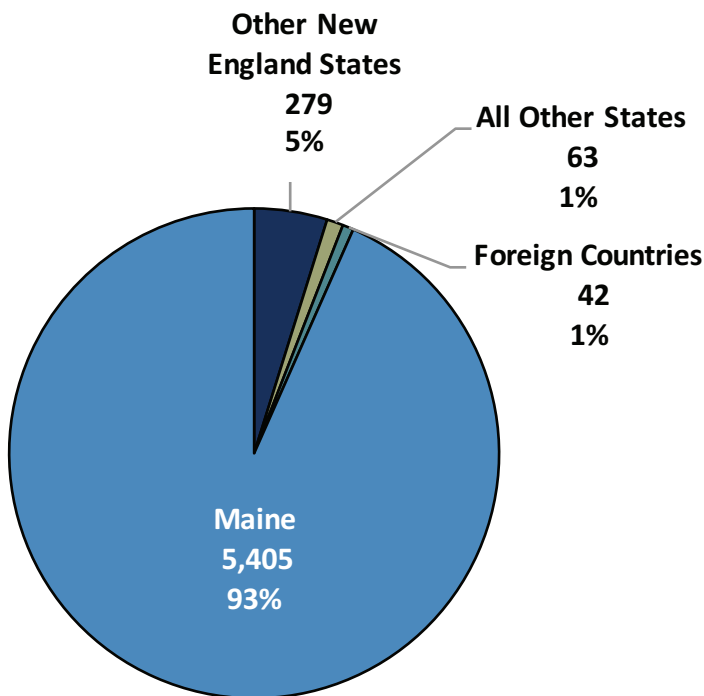


STUDENT PROFILE

Geographic Origin of Our Students

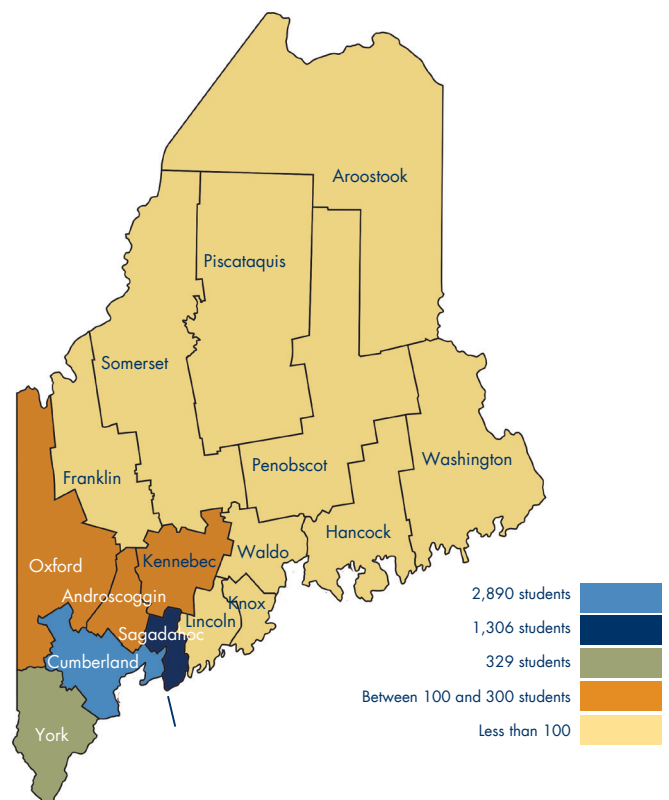

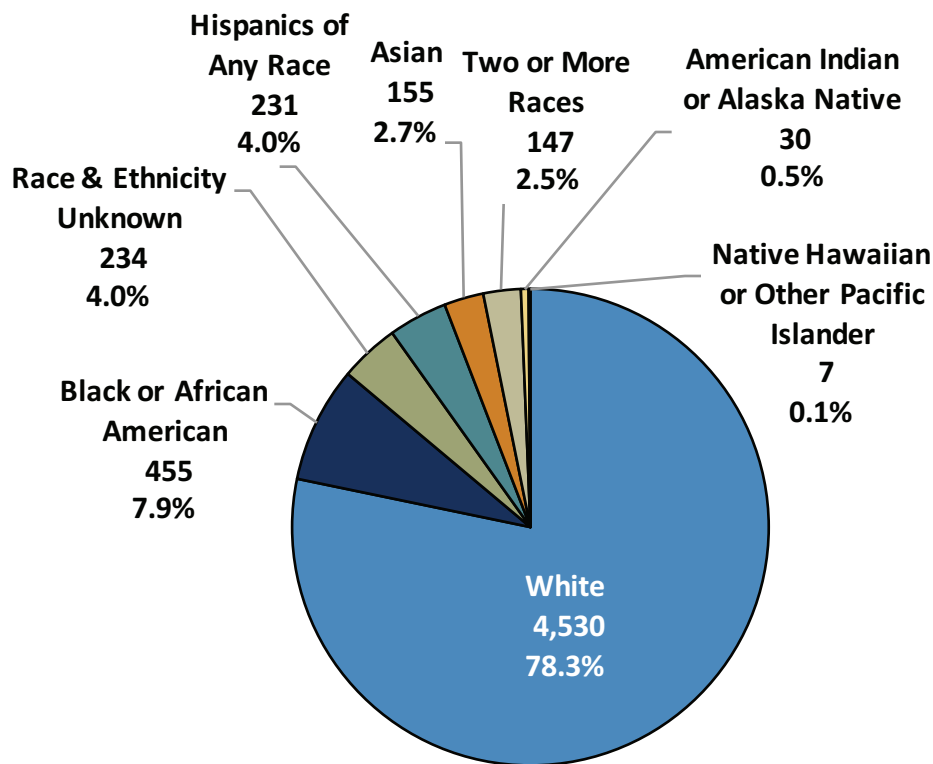

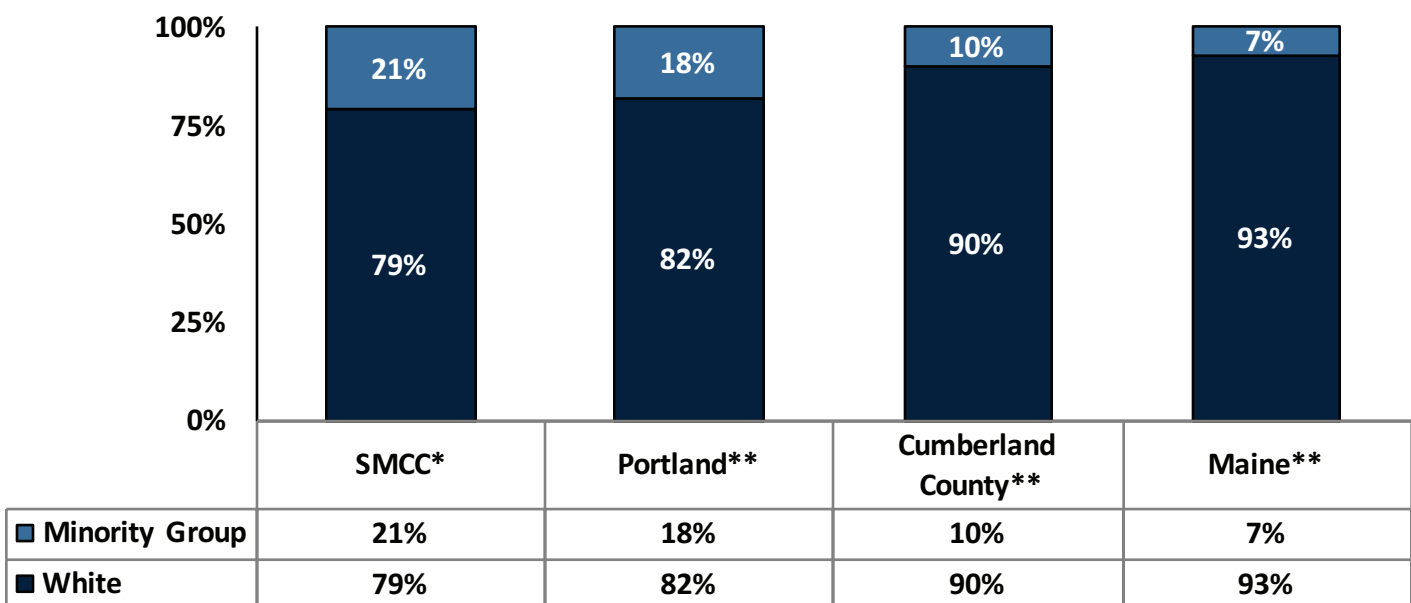

Student Race & Ethnicity



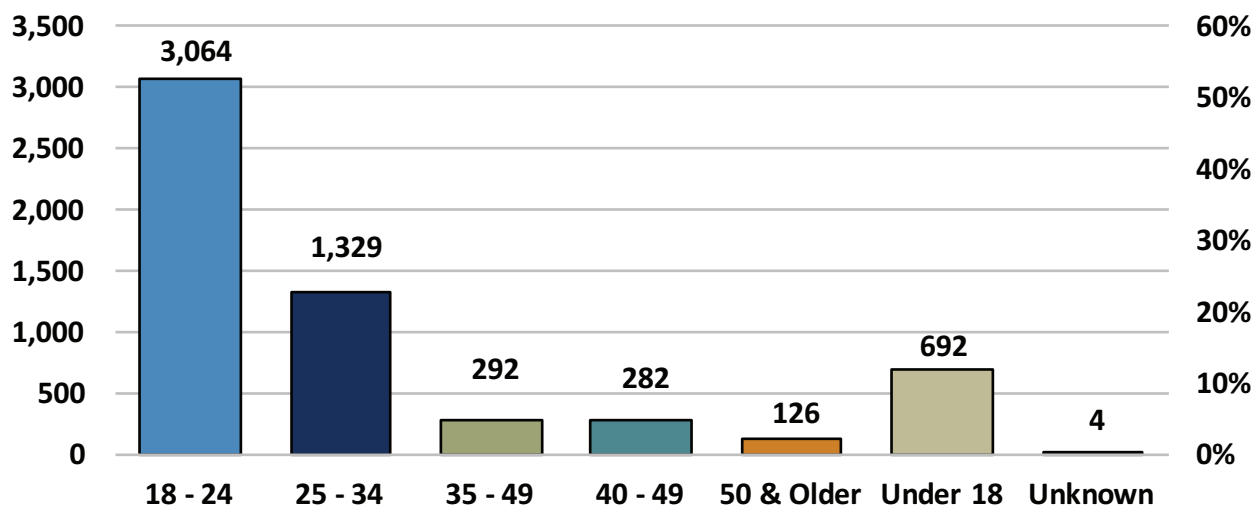
Student Minority Representation



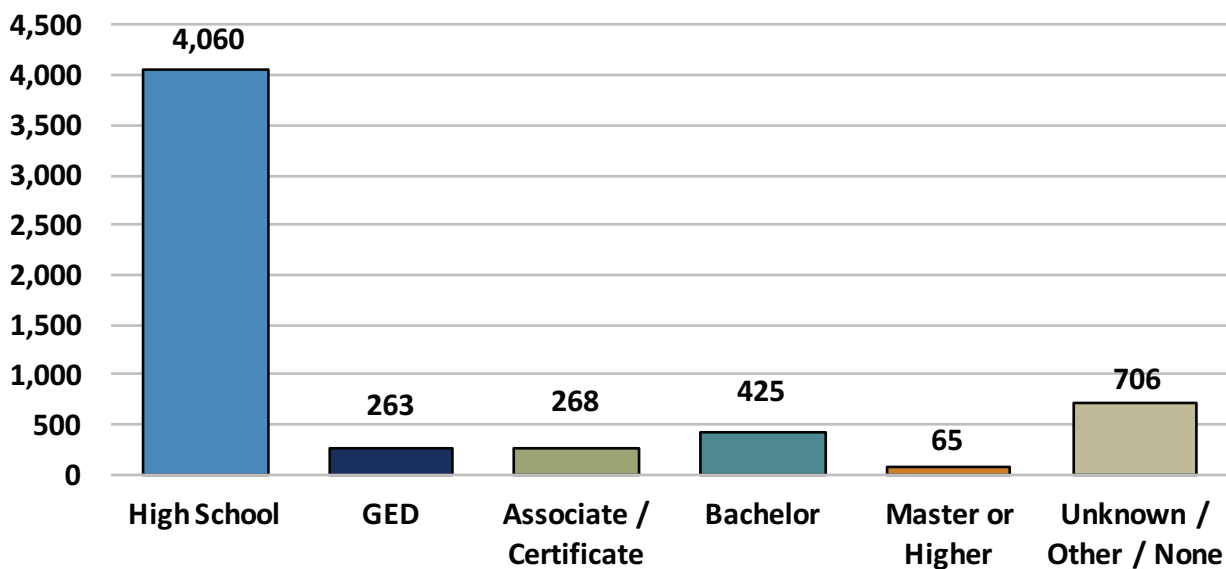

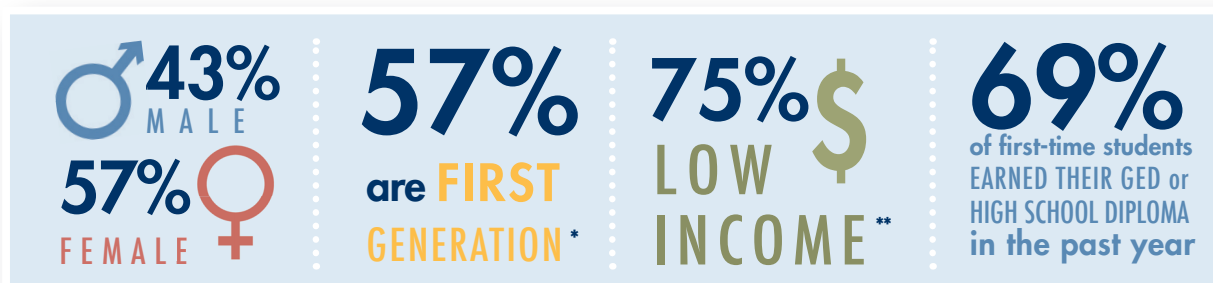
Student Ages

"I was making a huge decision in moving to Maine and enrolling at SMCC. I was uprooting my life to see if I like this kind of work. It turns out I love it."

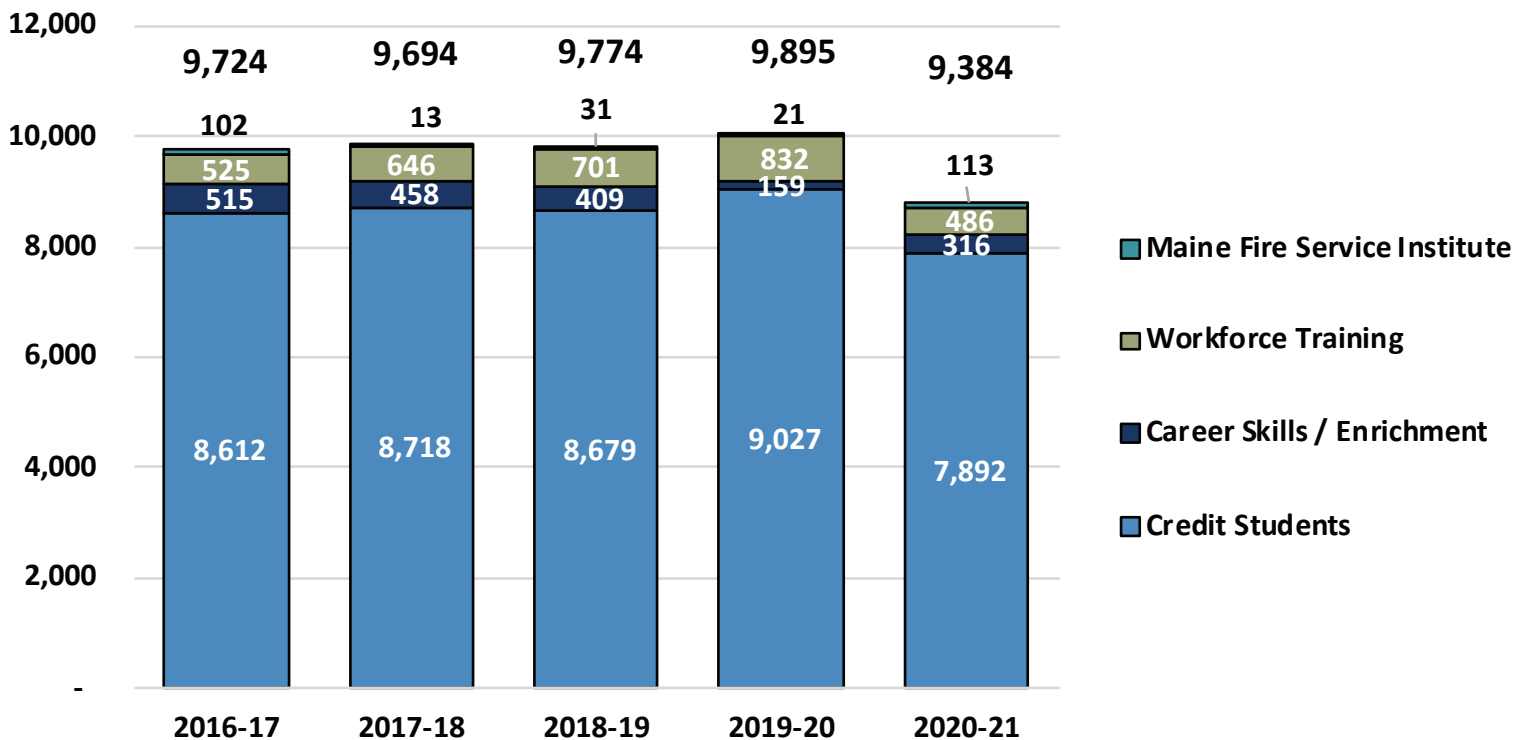


ENROLLMENT

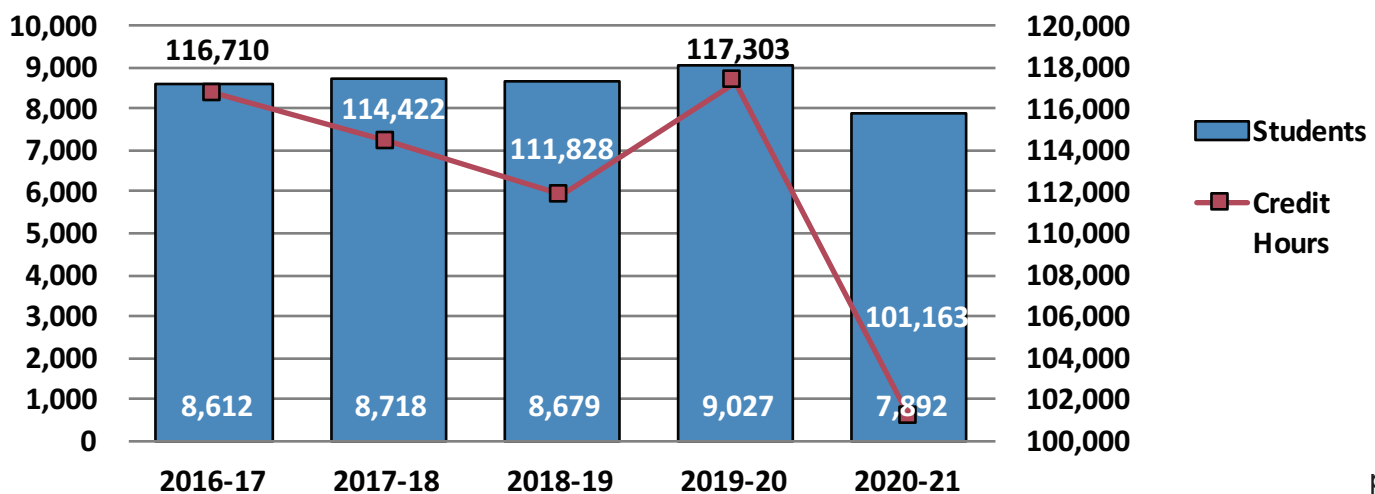
Individuals Served

Fall 2020 (credit & non-credit students)



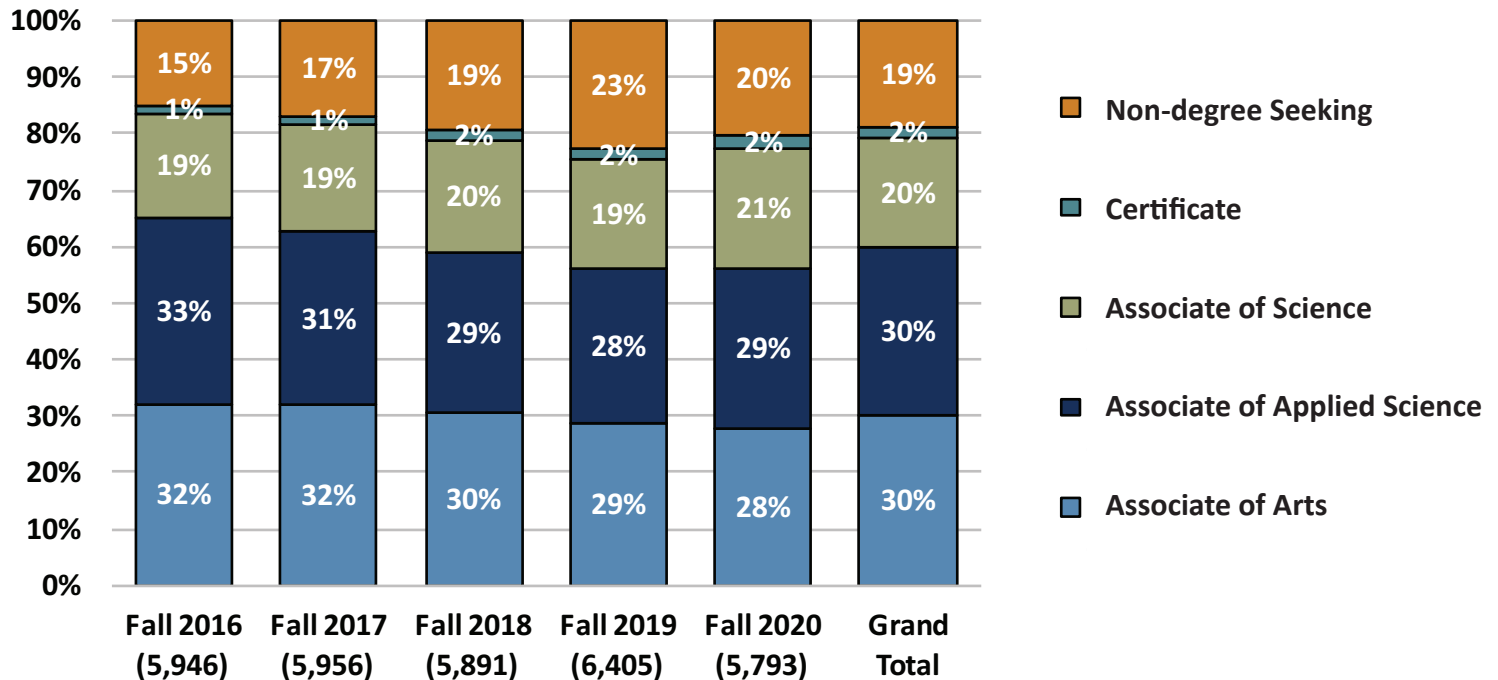

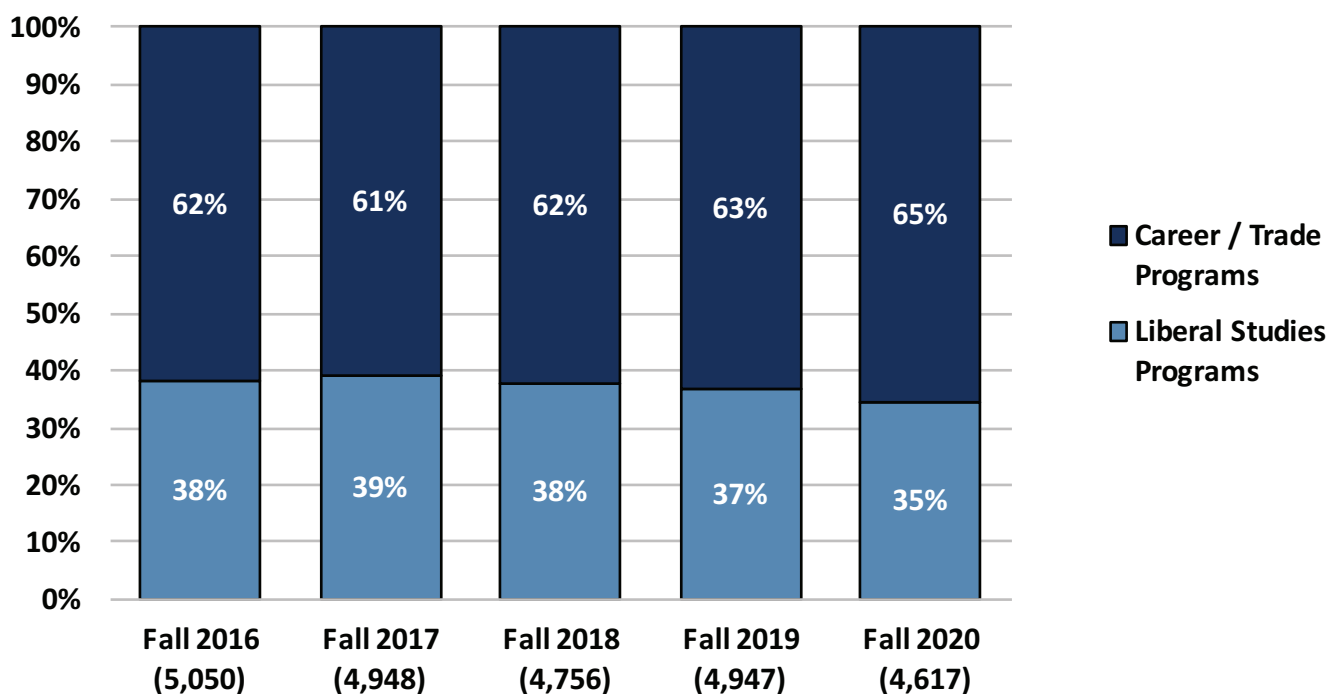

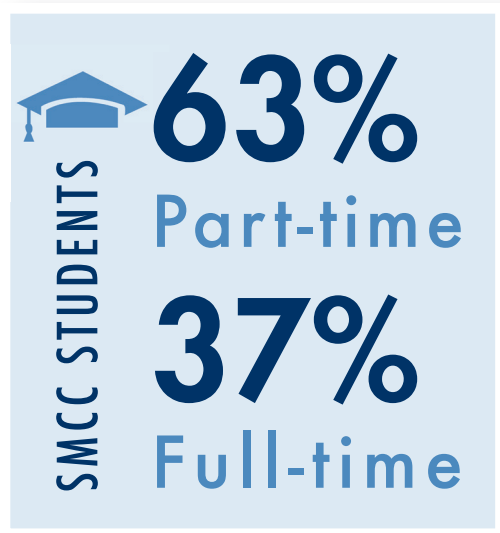
Enrollment by Degree Type



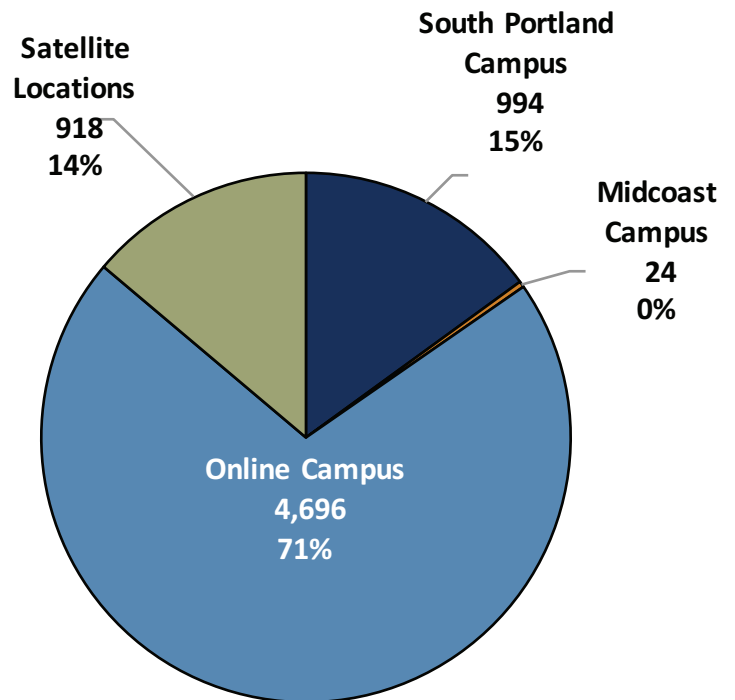
Enrollment in Degree Programs Career/Trade vs. Liberal Studies



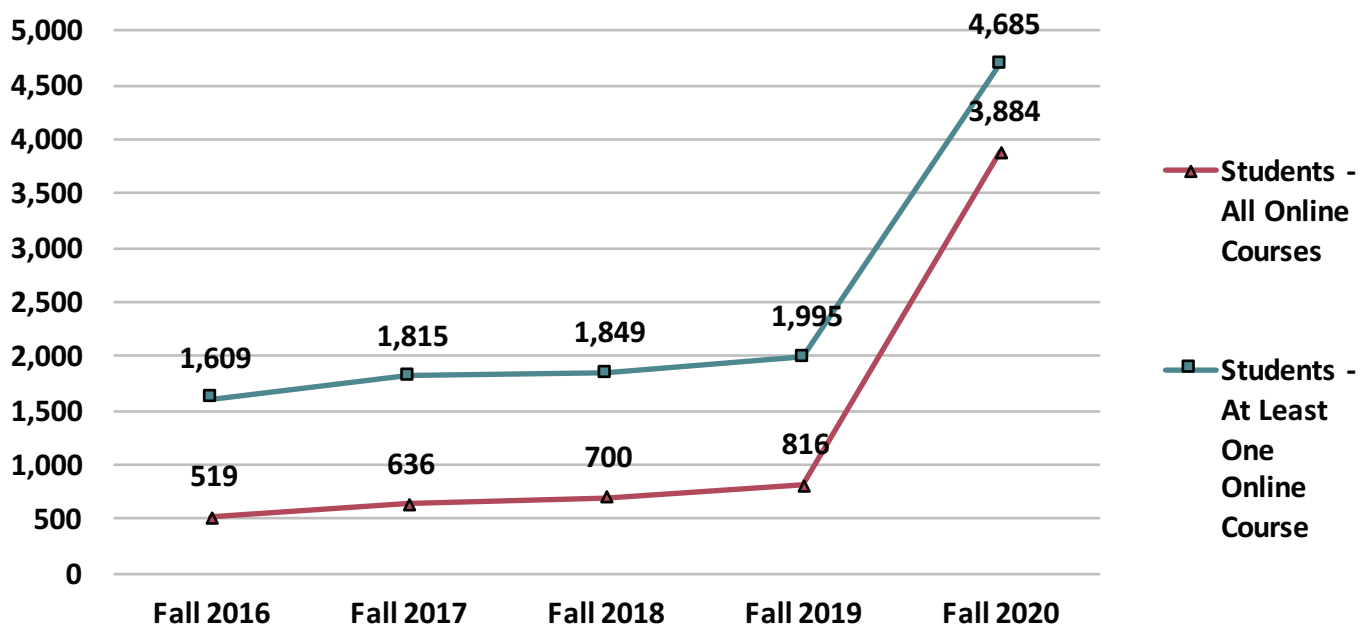
Full-time & Part-time Students

"SMCC gave me the right mix of classroom, laboratory and real-world hands-on learning experiences. It provided me the foundation and motivation to get where I am now."



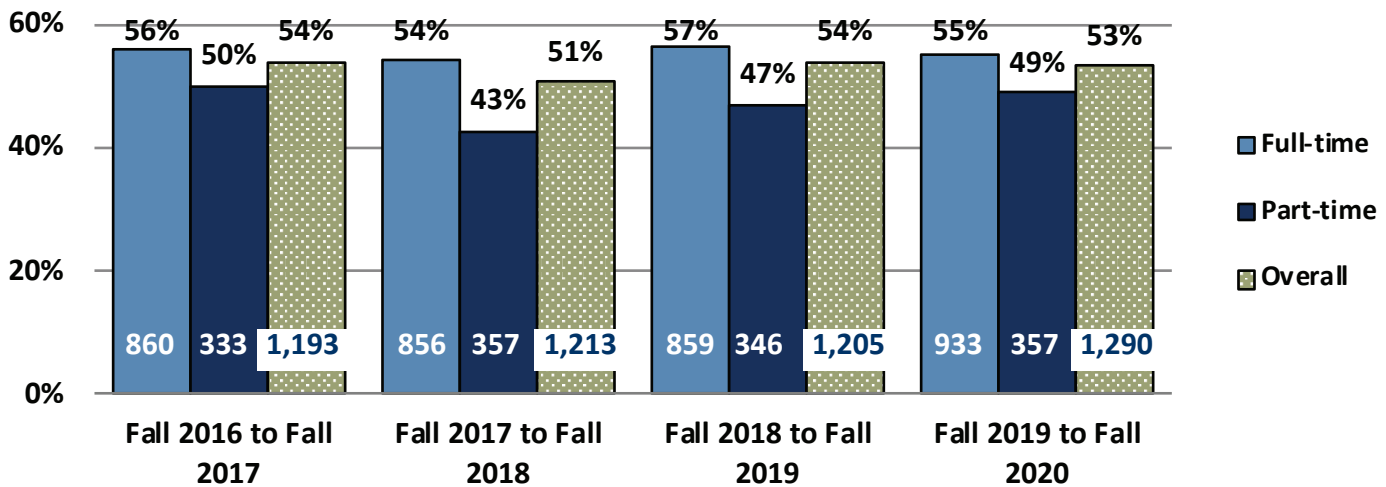

Fall to Fall Persistence Rates

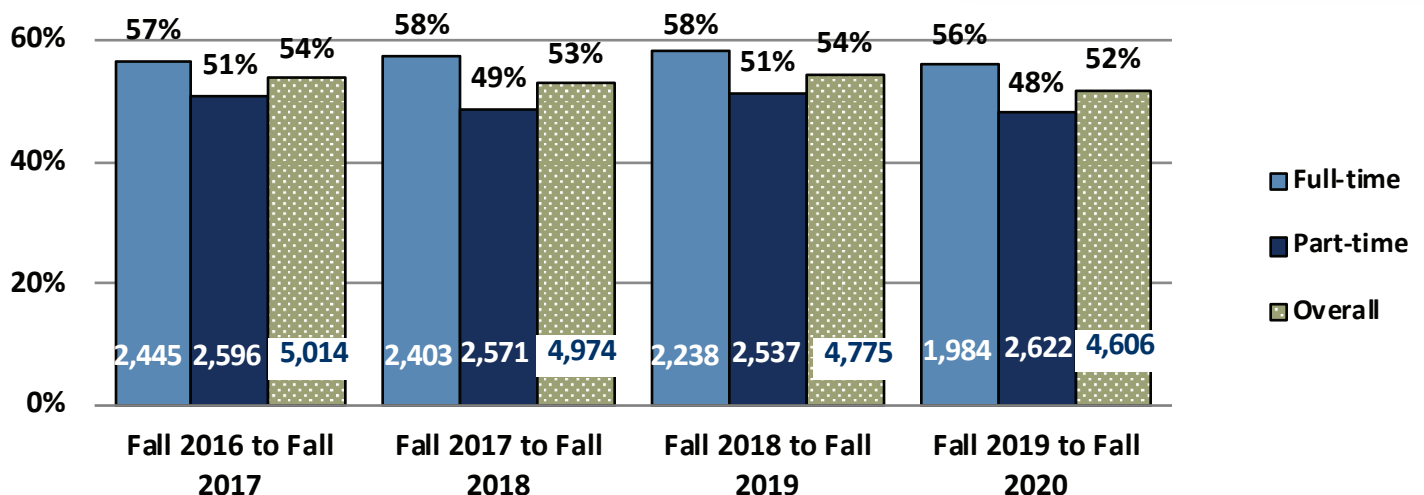
(first-time college degree-seeking students)



Fall to Fall Persistence Rates

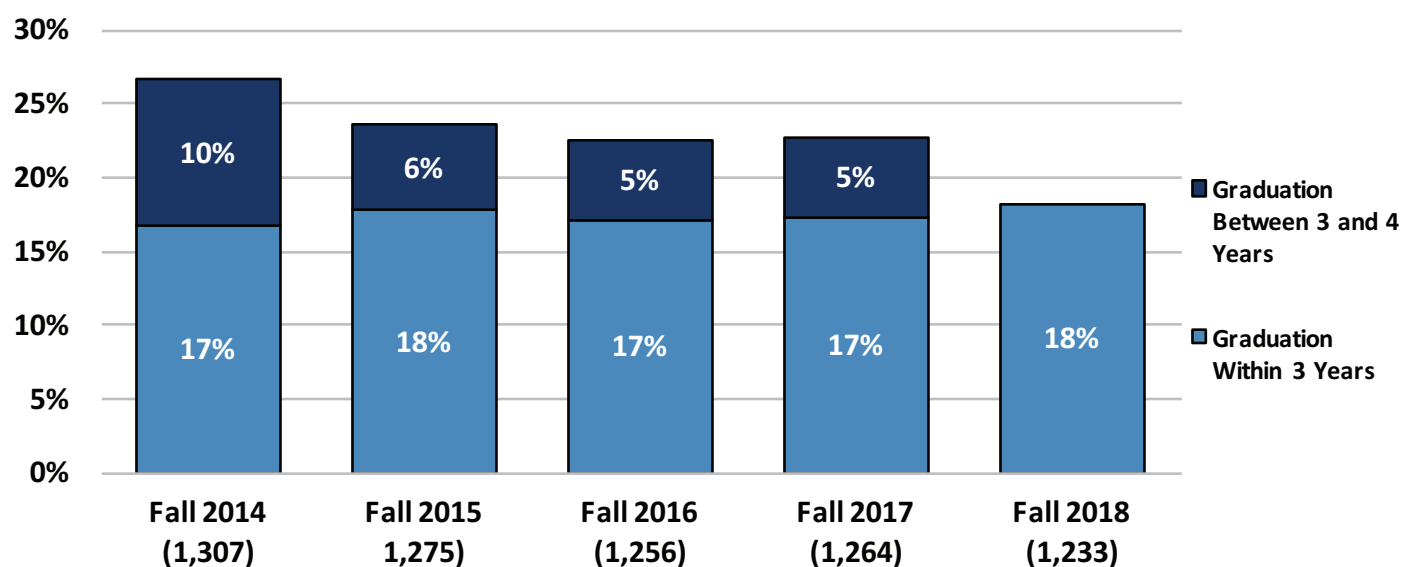

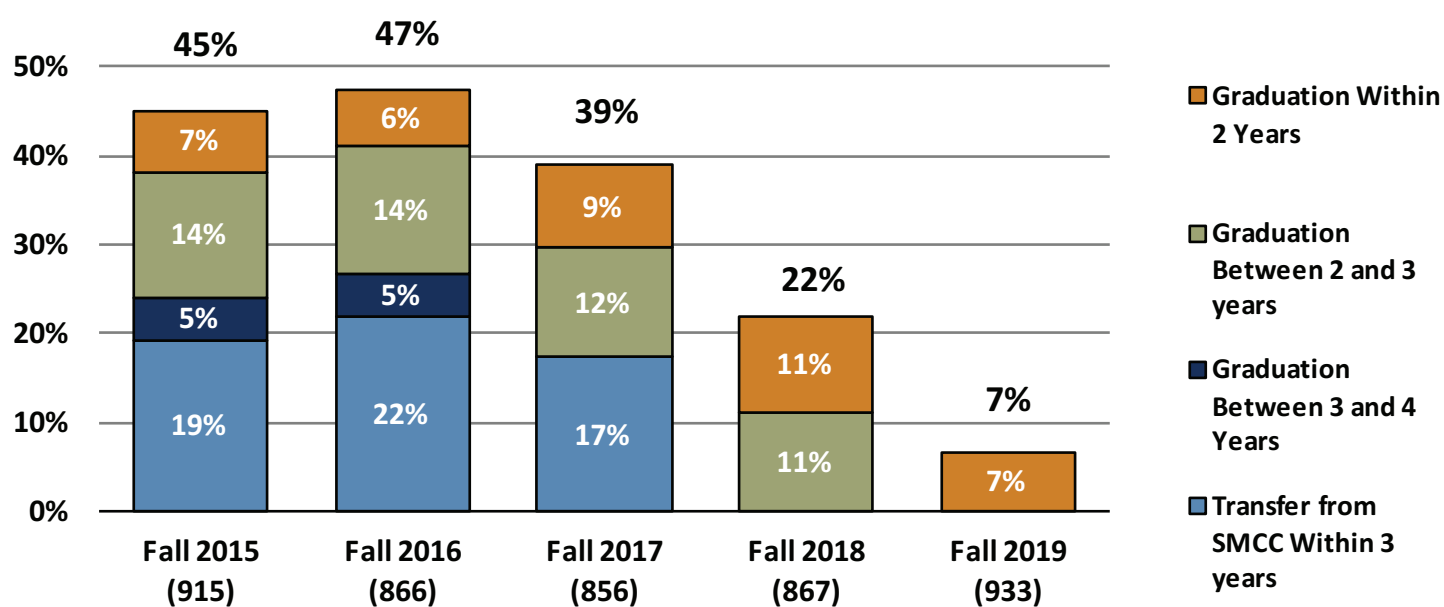
Graduation Rates

Student Success Services

ADVISING

Incoming students are required to attend an individual or group New Student Orientation & Advising session to plan, prepare and register for their first semester. Once students are registered for their first semester they are assigned a faculty advisor to discuss course selection and degree requirements. Students are also able to access walk-in advising services with staff through the Advising Office.

CAREER SERVICES

Career Services assists with job searches, career planning, resume development, job fair preparation and more. Career Services is one of the first stops students should make at SMCC to explore possible career goals and the educational pathways needed to reach them.

COUNSELING SERVICES

SMCC recognizes the importance of personal counseling to assist students in balancing their academic needs with problems or concerns of a personal, family-related or job-related nature. For that reason, we have partnered with Sweetser to provide counseling services to students. Sweetser bills students insurance companies if they have insurance or SMCC if the student does not have insurance. SMCC will also pay for any co-pay, co-insurance or deductible so that there is no out-of-pocket costs to students.

DISABILITY SERVICES

SMCC is committed to helping qualified students with disabilities achieve their individual educational goals. Upon request and verification of the disability, the College will provide service coordination and reasonable accommodations to remediate the competitive disadvantage that a disability can create in the educational setting.

FINANCIAL AID

SMCC is committed to helping our students and families with finding affordable ways to finance their college education. All students are encouraged to apply for federal financial aid. Many of our students receive assistance in the form of grants and scholarships, loans and student jobs.

TRANSFER SERVICES

At SMCC students can start their education and then transfer to a four-year college upon graduation, allowing them to earn their bachelor's degree for less. Transfer Services can help students determine what major to enroll in based on their desired degree, explore seamless transfer agreements, plan the steps to take to transfer and prepare for on-campus visits from or to four-year colleges and universities.

COMPUTER RESOURCES

Students have access to over 750 computers at the South Portland Campus and 150 computers at the Midcoast Campus.

LEARNING COMMONS

The Learning Commons at SMCC integrates the Library, Tutoring and the Writing Center in an active learning space at both our South Portland and Midcoast campuses. It offers students the resources and expertise they need to enhance their learning outside of the classroom to reach their academic goals.

The Library

The Library provides students with a strong and evolving collection of on-site books and periodicals, online access to the collections of libraries throughout the state of Maine, and a growing collection of electronic books, encyclopedias, journals, magazines and newspapers.

Tutoring & The Writing Center

Tutoring Services provide professional and peer tutoring in math, chemistry, physics, writing, english, computer applications, autoCAD and other subjects. The tutoring center also offers assistance with test-taking, study skills and other academic success strategies. The Writing Center offers one-to-one writing assistance, drop-in workshops, citation guides and additional resources. Both tutoring and writing services can be accessed online.

WISH Workshops

All SMCC students are enrolled in a free Blackboard course named "WISH-My Study Skills" which includes four modules with videos, quizzes and printable certificates. The aim is to give students practical steps they can take to succeed in the classroom and in college. The topics covered are time management, note-taking and reading methods, study skills and test taking. Students are also welcome to request a one-to-one consultation covering WISH topics with a Learning Commons tutor.

MY MAINE GUIDE

My Maine Guide is an online guide full of great resources for students to help them be successful. The guide has 6 sections: My Degree, My Courses, My Career & Transfer, My Money, My Learning and My Student Life.

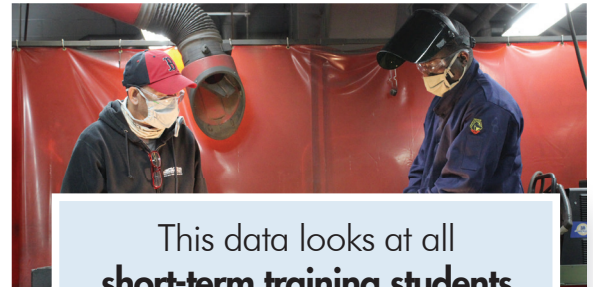

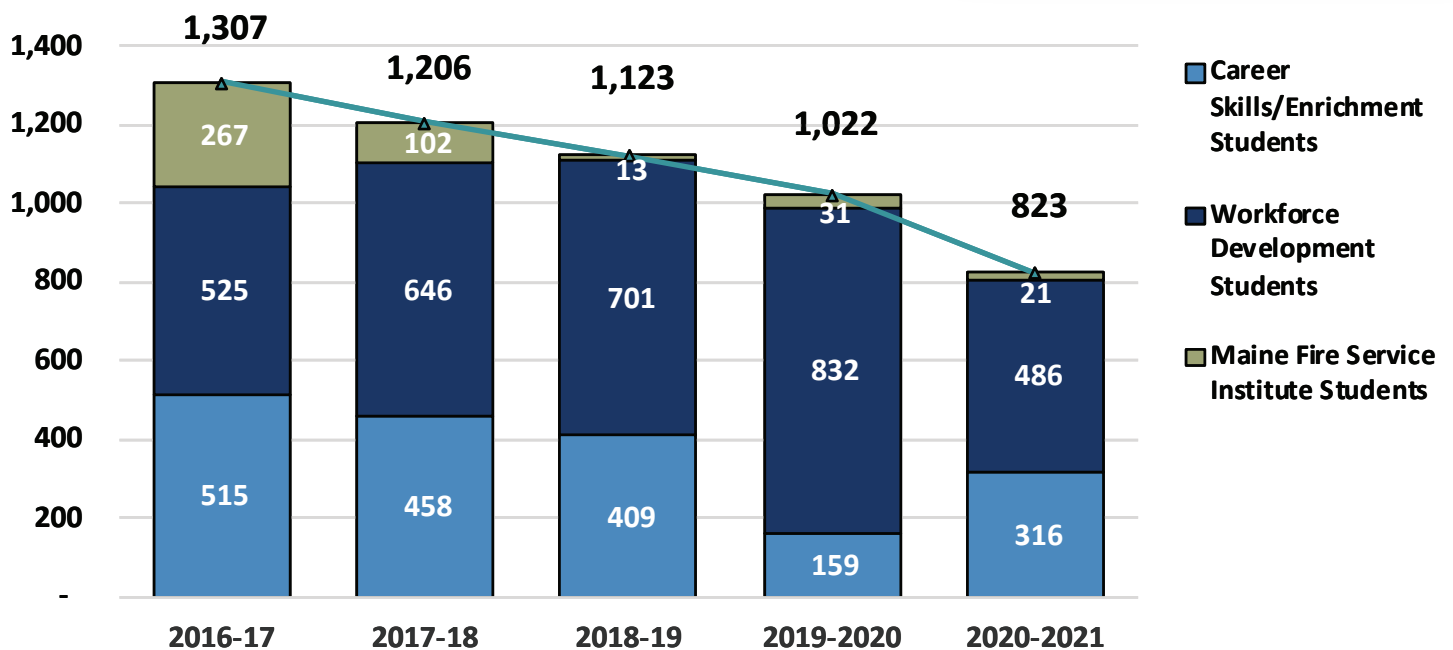
SHORT-TERM TRAINING OFFERINGS

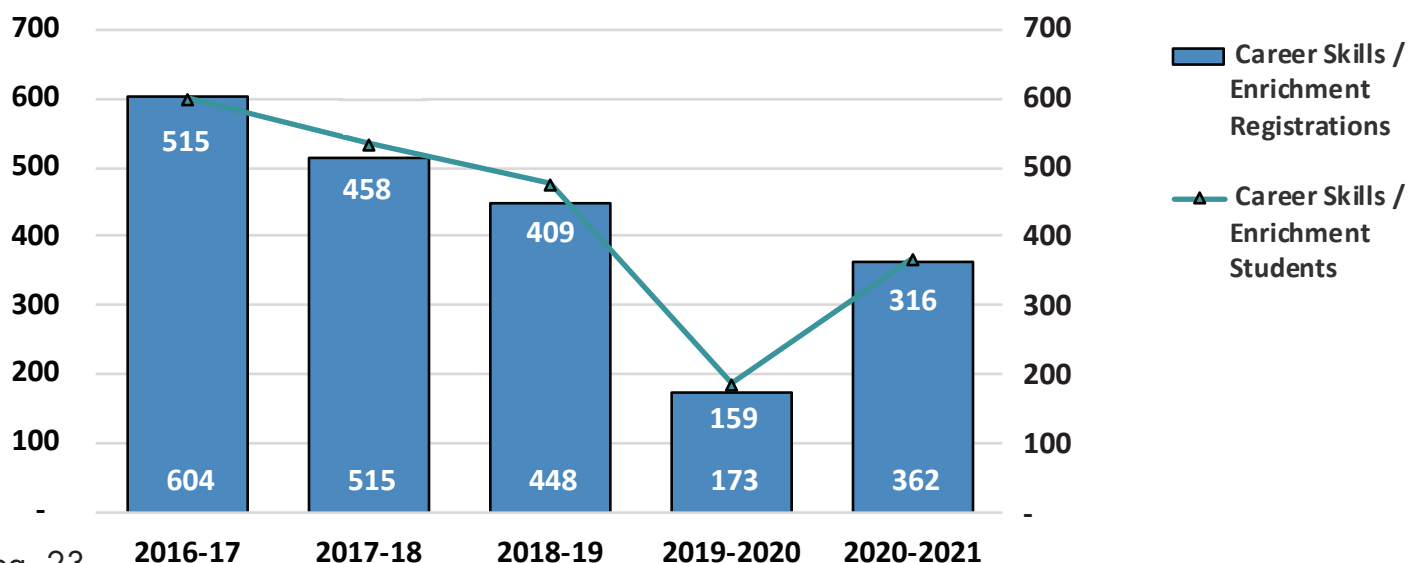

Short-Term Training Enrollment



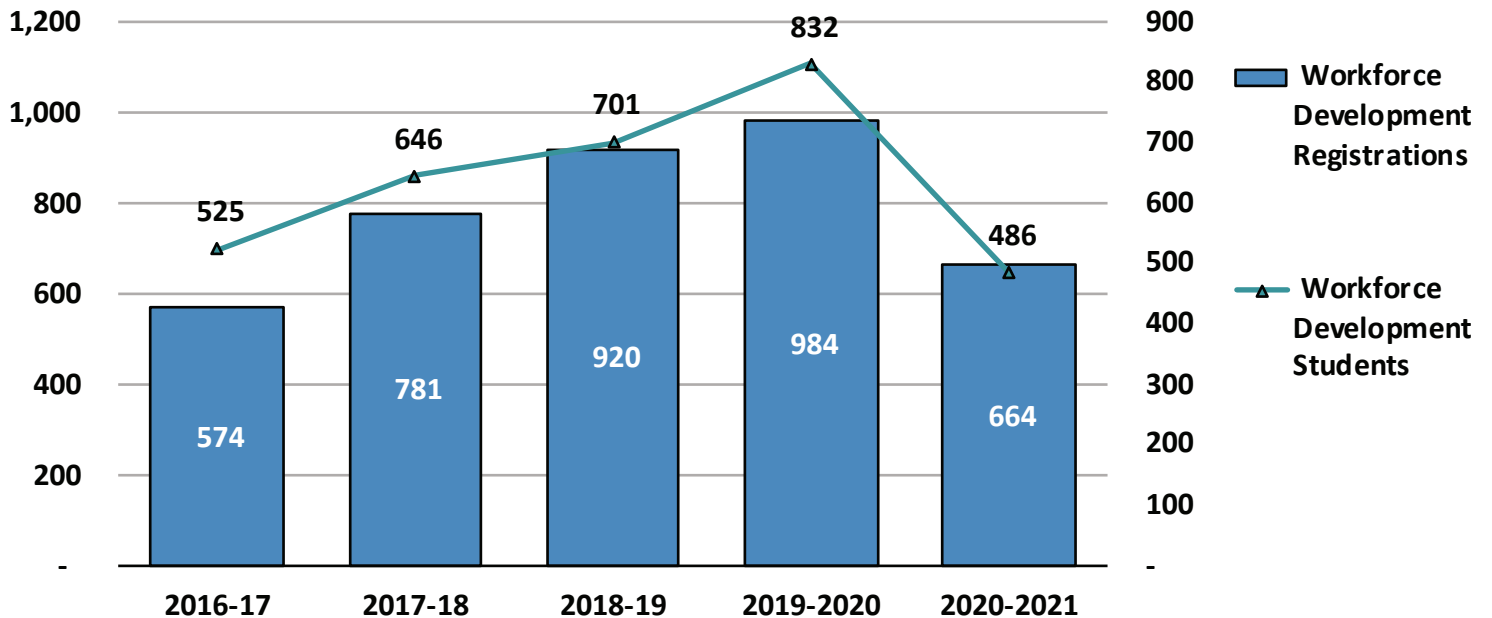

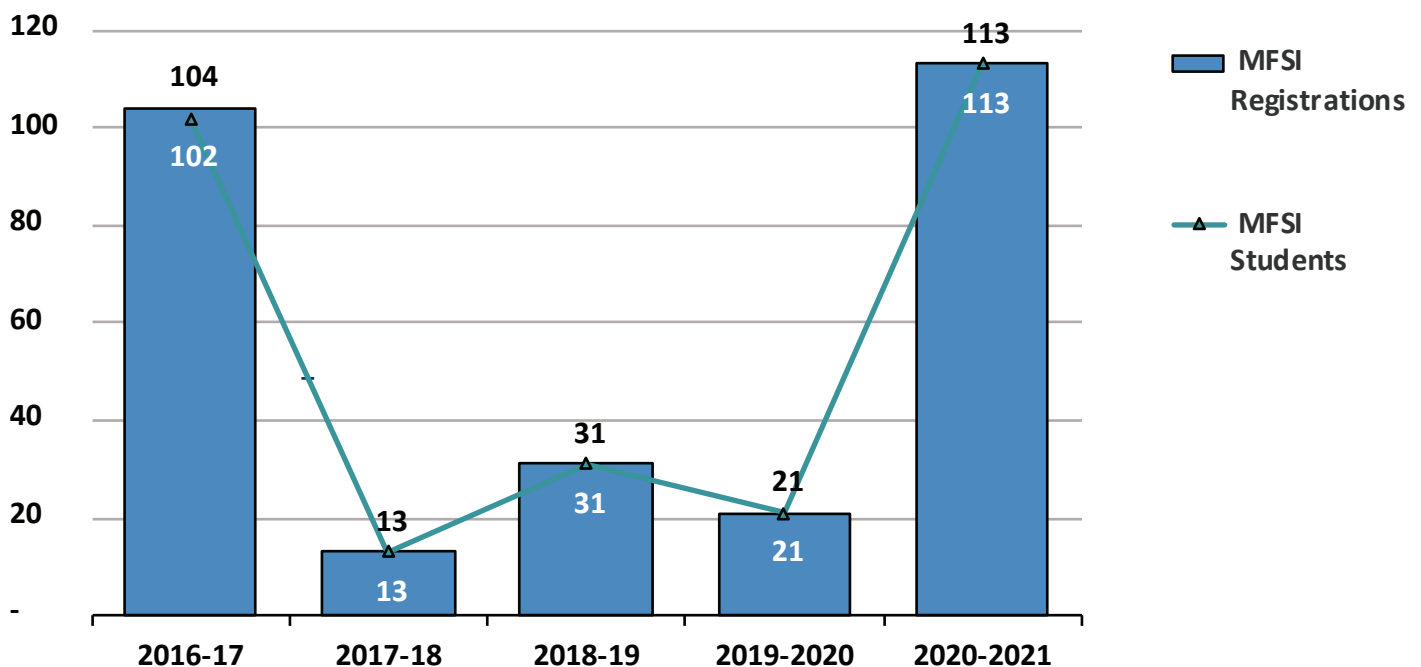
Workforce Development Enrollment

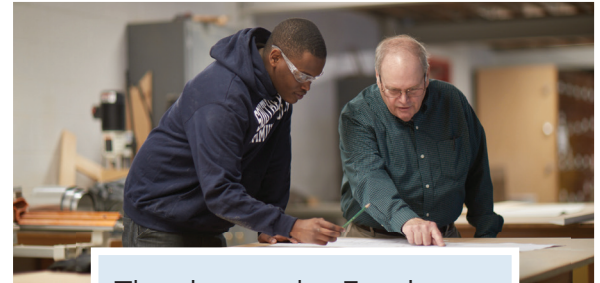

"It's exciting to have all the students' personalities and energy around me. I love getting to know them and helping them get a way to support themselves."



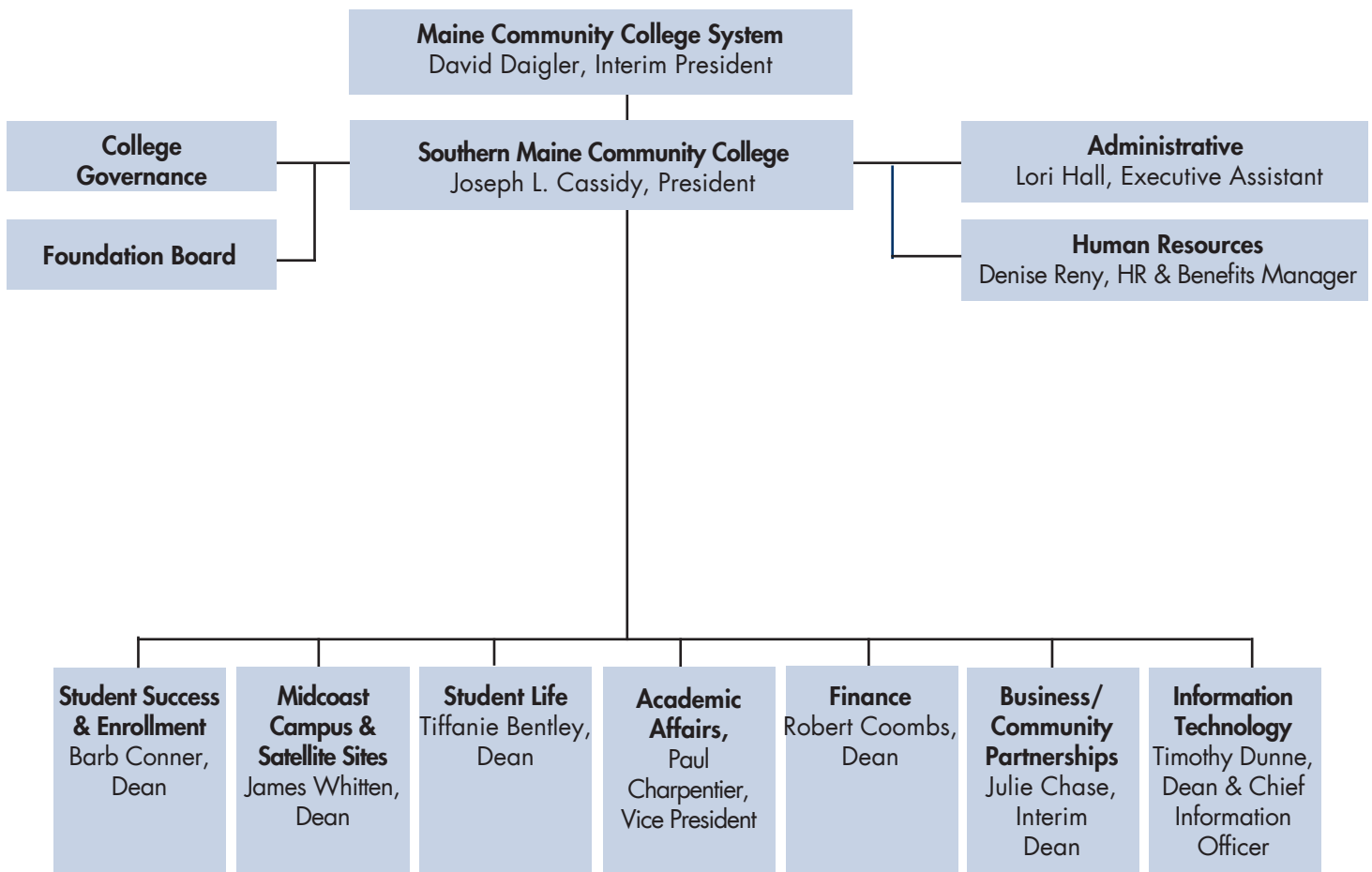
EMPLOYEES

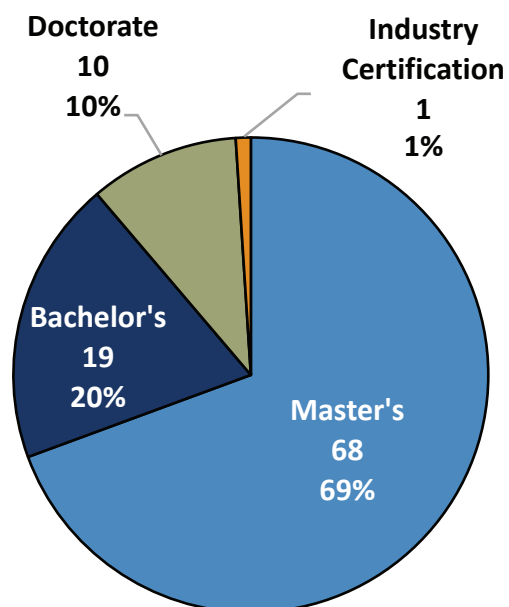

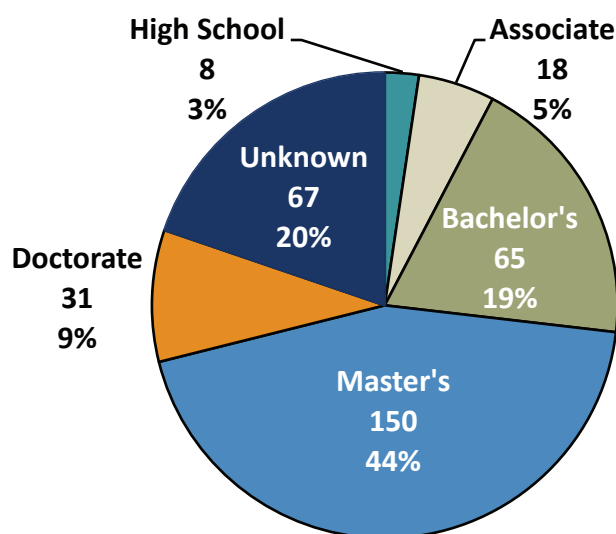
Organizational Chart



Educational Attainment of Faculty



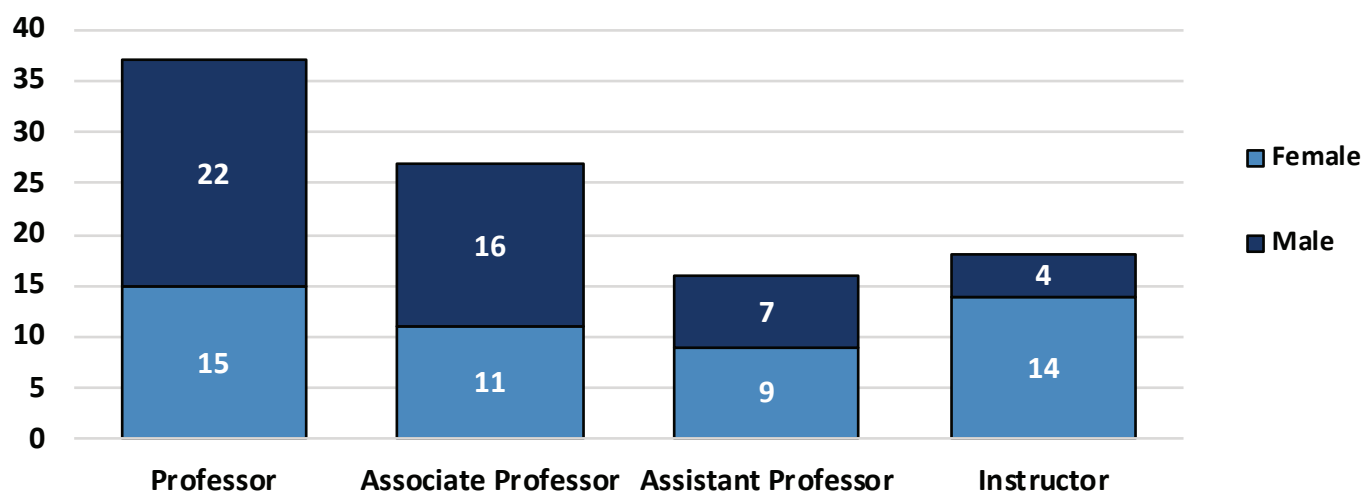
Educational Attainment of Adjunct Faculty



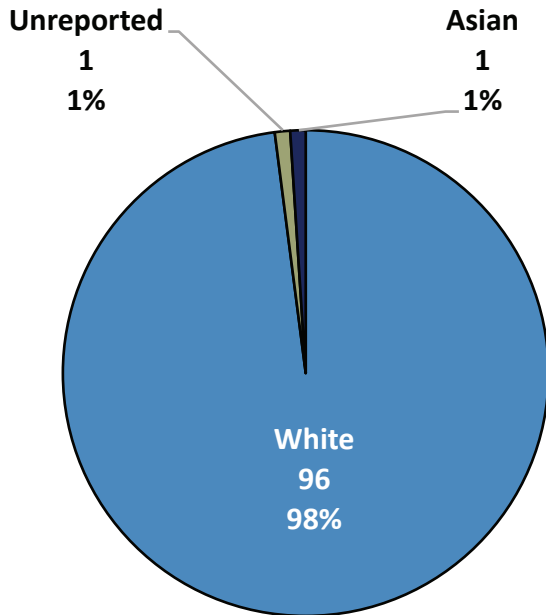

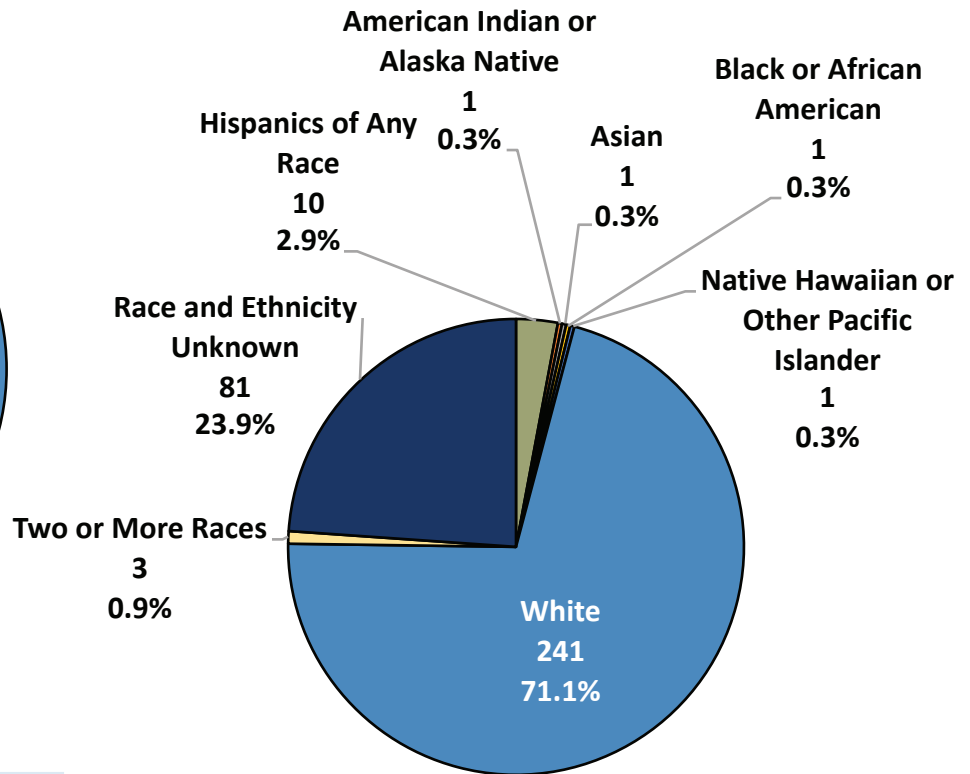
Rank and Gender of Full-time Faculty



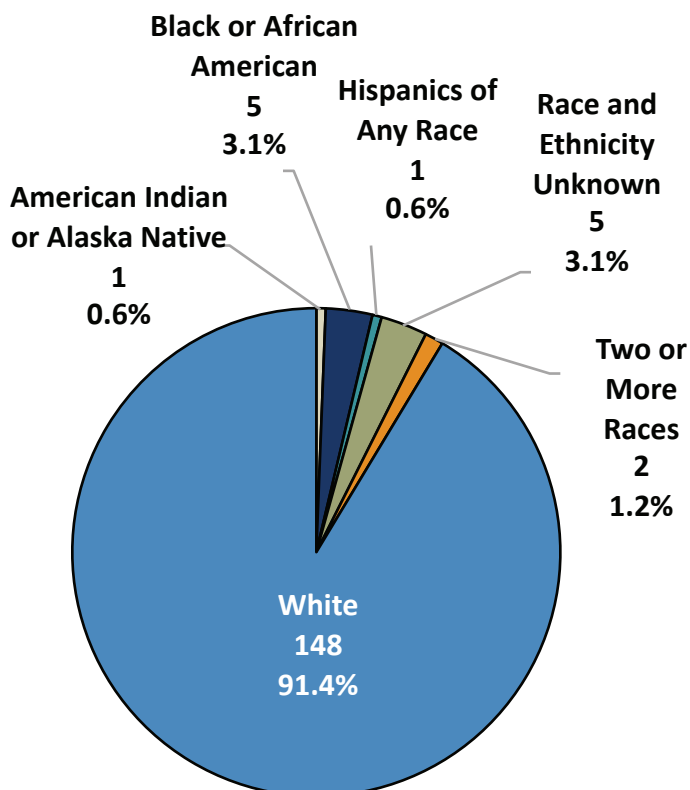

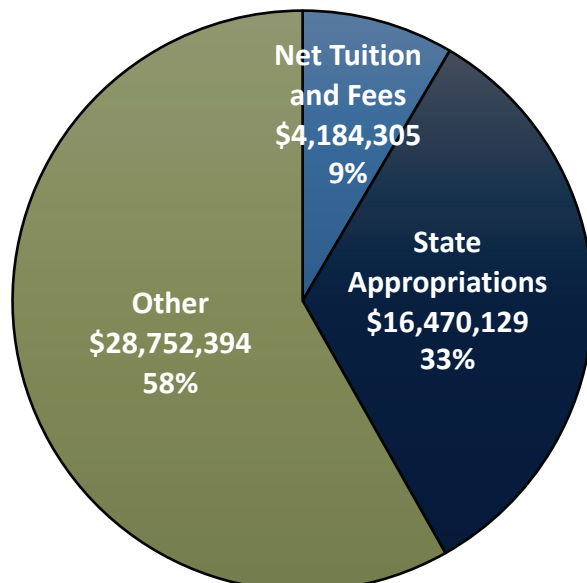
